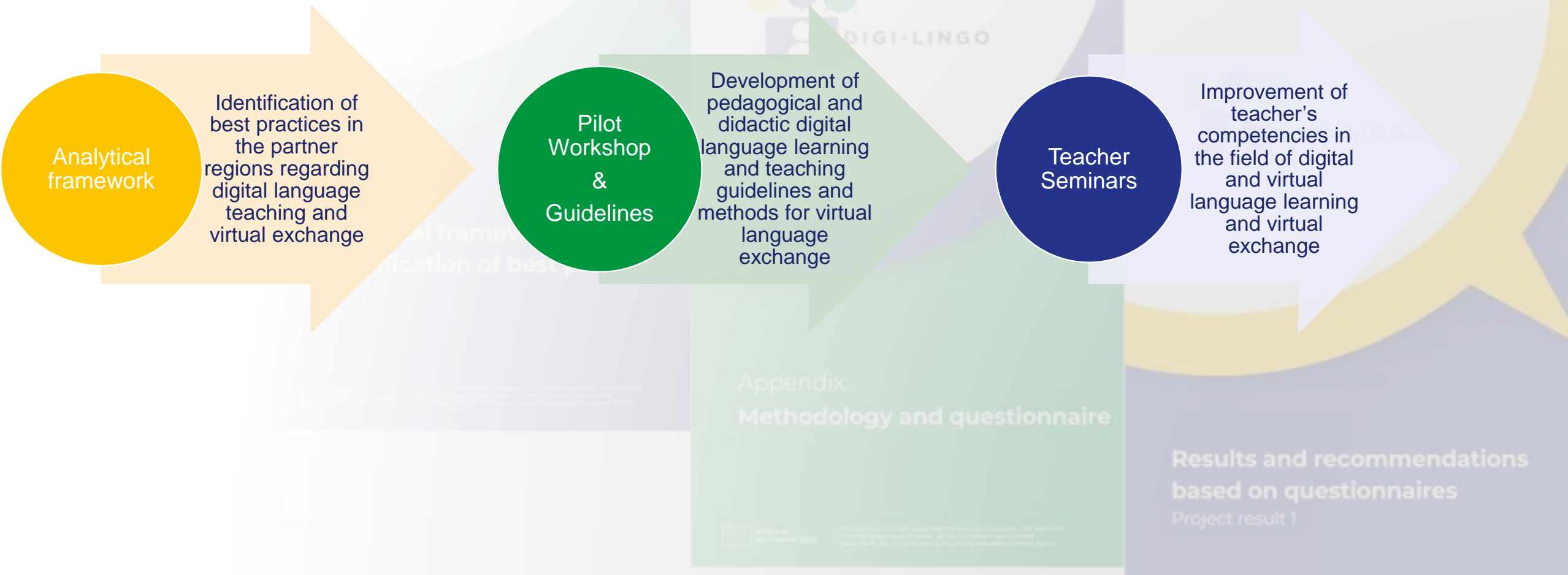

Challenges in Implementing Virtual Exchanges

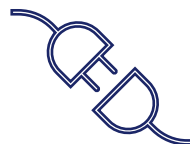
- Matching with teachers who have similar goals, student proficiency levels, and compatible schedules can be difficult.
- Uneven access to technology and varying levels of digital literacy among students and teachers.
- Coordinating virtual exchanges between classes in different time zones can be complex and may limit synchronous interactions.
- Integrating virtual exchanges into a packed curriculum without compromising core learning goals.

Components of the Organisational Model



Self-Study Module

Guides language teachers through key aspects of language learning in the digital age, while offering practical guidance on planning virtual exchanges, setting goals, structuring activities, and addressing common challenges.



Matchmaking Mechanism

Allows teachers to make groups based on the language they teach and the proficiency level of their students to align project ideas and facilitate partner finding for organising virtual exchanges.



Blending Self-Study and Matchmaking

A platform combining self-study materials and matchmaking processes, enabling like-minded language teachers to meet, find partners, and design virtual exchanges.

Pilot Workshop-Testing the Organisational Model



Digi-Lingo Pilot Workshop Series

- Took place online over three sessions in Sept-Oct 2024.
- Approximately 25 pilot teachers tested the organisational model and shared their feedback.
- The feedback was then integrated in the final version.
- Provided a valuable opportunity for the pilot teachers to network and explore potential future virtual exchanges.

Feedback survey:

- The self-study module length and content met participants' expectations.
- Content was practical, relevant, and concise.
- Matchmaking mechanism was easy to use.
- Clear guidance and instructions were provided throughout.

Areas for improvement:

- Linguistic improvements: simplify the language used.
- Additional activities for interaction among the participants.
- Additional languages to be added in Teams.
